Market Rate Housing Update

The City of Springfield will release results of its market rate housing study at an event sponsored by the Springfield Chamber of Commerce on November 14 from 10:30-11:30 a.m. at One Financial Plaza, 9th Floor, Springfield.



The latest market rate housing study occurred in 2006 and, with a significant change in the housing market as well as a major mixed use casino development being proposed, this update will serve to inform developers, property owners and financial institutions of the opportunity in downtown Springfield for new market rate housing construction and conversions.

Guest speaker will be Laurie Volk of Zimmerman/Volk Associates, the firm that undertook the study. Volk is a nationally acclaimed researcher in this field and has worked in major cities across the country in examining the development of new housing in urban centers.

The study was supported by a grant from the Economic Development Administration via a partnership with the Pioneer Valley Planning Commission.

Education Reform - Did It Work?

2013 marks the 20th year of the Education Reform Act of 1993. Obviously, there are lots of questions for employers - large and small - and across all industries: What has the reform meant for the employer community? 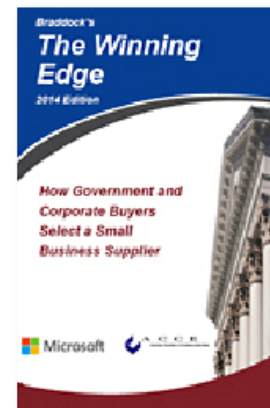
